
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



SUPPORTING PERMANENT DIACONATE

Last fall 2018, Bishop Peter Christensen ordained nine men to the Permanent Diaconate. Permanent deacons help the local pastor by visiting the sick, teaching the faith, counseling couples and individuals, working on parish committees and councils, and giving advice to the pastor. Deacons can baptize, witness marriages, perform funeral and burial services outside of Mass, distribute Holy Communion, and preach the homily.



"What was God thinking? Surely, he'd made a mistake!" Deacon Cuppage said. "But we shared this calling; a calling from God to serve His people; a call to the diaconate," he said.

"By God's grace, we persevered. We grew together. We've supported each other, embraced each other and have become true brothers in Christ."
