

Holy Week invites us to participate in the timeless Paschal Mystery, the saving life, suffering, passion, death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Over the course of this Holy Week we attend the Last Supper and receive the gift of the Holy Eucharist, the Body, Blood Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. We attend Good Friday services to pray and meditate on Christ's passion. We venerate His Holy Cross. At the Great Vigil of Easter, the service begins with the kindling of a new fire - the light of Christ breaking into the darkness of our world.
