Alleluia! Our praise word has been silent for 40 days, Alleluia means "Praise Ye, Lord," and we sing it out in joyful trinities today. Praise is as common to our liturgical life as petition, but we tend to overlook it. The Eucharistic prayer at the heart of the Mass is a prayer of praise and thanksgiving, which teaches us something about the order of such prayer. Praising God is naturally followed by litanies of reason flowing from grateful hearts. Our Responsorial Psalms, interspersed throughout the Easter Vigil and sung at every Mass, dance with the opportunity to give praise to the One who keeps all promises. Alleluia!

OLR's Weekly Mass Etiquette: Things To Do And Not Do In Mass!

- Please be quiet while in church. Once you enter the sanctuary - it is not the time or place to visit with those around you. If you must talk do so as quietly and briefly as possible. Remember that your conversation might be disturbing someone who is in prayer, which is much more important. <u>Sssshhhhhhhh!</u>
- <u>Prayer after Mass</u>, if you feel called to do so. It is a good custom, though not required, to offer a prayer of thanksgiving after Mass is over.
- <u>Leave quietly.</u> We encourage you to visit with others, but only after you are outside of the main sanctuary of the church so you won't disturb others who want to stay and pray. So, please leave quietly and then have then visit afterward.





The Sunday after Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday!

How should we prepare for this great Feast of Mercy?



Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened." (Diary 699)*

Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to Confession (preferably before that Sunday) and receive Holy Communion (on Divine Mercy Sunday) shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699)*

The Image of The Divine Mercy, with the words, "Jesus I Trust in You", is on display in Our Lady of the Rosary Church. Our Lord said "I want the image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish". (Diary 341,48)*

Jesus spoke to Saint Faustina (and by extension, all of us), "But child, you are not yet in your homeland; so go, fortified by My grace, and fight for My kingdom in human souls; fight as a king's child would; and remember that the days of your exile will pass quickly, and with them the possibility of earning merit for heaven. I expect from you, My child, a great number of souls who will glorify My mercy for all eternity." (Diary 1489)* Saint Faustina responds: "Every soul You have entrusted to me, Jesus, I will try to aid with prayer and sacrifice, so that Your grace can work in them. O great lover of souls, my Jesus, I thank You for this immense confidence with which You have deigned to place souls in our care." (Diary 245)*

May we all pray: Grant, Merciful Lord, that not even one of those souls which You have entrusted to us be lost. Amen.

Encourage all of your family and friends to take advantage of these incredible promises and the additional Plenary Indulgence bestowed by Pope St. John Paul II for this Feast of Mercy.

We will be celebrating this great Feast Day with Benediction, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, singing the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Veneration of the Image of Divine Mercy.




