The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The RCIA is the method by which adults receive the Catholic sacraments of initiation; Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. Children and Youth, age 7-18

follow a similar program. Those who have been validly baptized in another Christian denomination are not baptized again but are received into full communion with the Catholic Church through a profession of faith following catechesis. The sacraments of initiation are normally conferred during the Easter Vigil Mass. Our Lady of the Rosary typically begins preparation in early September.
