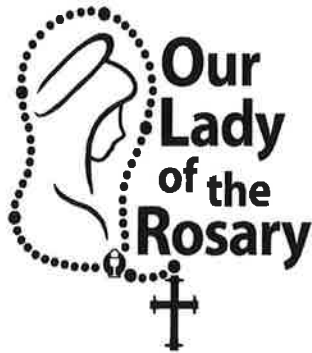


Welcome to the 16th Sunday of Ordinary Time, July 18, 2021
