## Moments of Mercy

~Saints of Mercy ~

Visit the Imprisoned: St. John Bosco (1815-1888) St. John Bosco was a priest in Italy. He devoted his life educating faith to the abandoned young. He often visited those in prisons and was disturbed by their misery in body and soul. He wanted to do something to prevent them from going back to prisons again. St. John bought little gifts to befriend them and encouraged them to visit his Oratory upon their release. Gathered in the Oratory, these youths were protected from bad company. They learned about the Faith and the skills they needed to make a living. Eventually they became good Christians and honest citizens.

Forgive Offences Willingly: Pope St. John Paul II (1920 - 2005) St. John Paul II was the head of the Catholic Church from 1978 to 2005. He was an inspiring leader with great faith and love for the people of God. Although he courageously stood up for what was right, some people saw him as their enemy and tried to get rid of him. One day, while he was receiving the crowds, a gunman shot him at a close distance and wounded him badly. St. Jon Paul II miraculously survived. After his recovery, he visited the gunman in prison and forgave him.


