Moments of Mercy ~

Instruct the Ignorant: St. Francis Xavier (1506-1552) St. Francis was a Jesuit priest from Spain. When he was younger, he cared only for worldly things. He decided to give his life to God after meeting St. Ignatius of Loyola. He was sent to preach the Word of God to the people in Asia. He spent his time preaching, instructing and baptizing those who had never heard about God. Although he faced many difficulties, St. Francis Xavier did not give up. He travelled to India, Indonesia, Japan, Malacca, and near China in his lifetime. He led so many people to God that he was made the patron saint of foreign missions.

Counsel the Doubtful: St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556) was a priest from Spain who founded the Society of Jesus (The Jesuits) He was well known for the rules of spiritual discernment and helped people to understand what was of God and what was not. His good friend St. Peter Faber had long suffered from painful doubts and could not find peace. St. Ignatius helped him to understand what he was going through. He also advised him to go for weekly confession, examine his conscience and receive the Eucharist daily. St. Peter Faber felt more peaceful thereafter.


