
### Welcome to the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 3, 2021

# BISHOP PETER SUPPORTS ARCHBISHOP GOMEZ' REQUEST FOR SECOND COLLECTION TO ASSIST STORM VICTIMS



**Sept. 14, 2021** – Bishop Peter Christensen of the Diocese of Boise is asking priests in the diocese to consider taking up a voluntary collection at the conclusion of all Masses on the weekend of Oct. 2-3 for the benefit of the Bishops' Emergency Disaster Fund.

Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), recently sent a letter to all U.S. bishops asking them to consider the collection to assist with the humanitarian, long-term recovery, and significant Church needs stemming from Hurricane Ida.

The hurricane made landfall in the Gulf Coast and made its way inland as a tropical storm, causing damage across several states along the East Coast. Archbishop Gomez's request follows another request he made several weeks ago to the bishops where he asked them to consider a voluntary special collection for Haiti in the aftermath of the Aug. 14 earthquake and Tropical Storm Grace.

Bishop Peter requests that the second collection take place at the conclusion of Mass. Once the donations are counted, parishes are asked to then write a single check to the Diocese, which will then forward the funds to the USCCB during the week of October 4-8.

In his letter sent to bishops, Archbishop Gomez detailed that the funds collected in this special appeal would be used to support the pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church, as well as the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and/or Catholic Relief Services. These official relief agencies of the U.S. Catholic Church along with their local agencies respond to immediate emergency needs and recovery efforts.

Funds will be distributed where they are most needed in response to the hurricane and the impact of subsequent flooding and tornados.


Recognizing the financial challenges posed by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic on parish and diocesan activities, but also acknowledging the great need for supporting the recovery efforts from the natural disasters that have hit the dioceses, Archbishop Gomez expressed hope in the generosity of the faithful and their care for those in need.

#### God is Love

# "Lead us not into temptation ..."

No one is exempt from temptation. Being enticed by

the attractions of this world is part of our human condition, but successfully fighting it makes us stronger and holier.

Watch for it.

Temptation
strikes when we
are least able
to fight it.
Identify what
tempts you most and
try to anticipate when you are
weakest. Then devise a plan of action
– not just a resolution – to help you

Pray through it. When Jesus caught His disciples sleeping in the garden instead of praying, He said, "Watch

and pray that you may not undergo the test" (Matthew 26:41). Overcome temptation by being alert to

it and praying instead of indulging in it.

Run from it.
Sometimes fleeing temptation is the best way to resist it. "God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it" (1 Corinthians 10:13). Avoid people, places or situations that give you trouble.

Don't start it. It is easier to resist temptation if you stop it when it starts. Then it won't have the force of habit. Though it is never too late to ask for God's help, the longer you live with the temptation, the harder it will be to turn to Him.




## God's love never changes

#### Mark 12:28-34 -The first Commandment

The Jewish authorities often tried to draw Jesus out and get Him to say

something counter to Jewish law. That way He could be discredited - or worse. Yet, the strategy never worked for them. In fact, one of the scribes was so impressed by Jesus' response to a challenge by the Sadducees that he posed a question of his own. He sincerely wanted to learn from Jesus' answer.

The scribe asked which of the commandments was most important. Jesus said everything starts and ends with love - love of God and love of each other. To love God is to

love one another. They are as inseparable as the beams of the cross. While it is easy to love

God, loving others is more difficult.

> But true love of neighbor is measured by how we treat those who are neither family nor friends. It means including people when the natural inclination is to exclude or avoid them. Jesus loved prostitutes, thieves, lepers, even His political

enemies. This is how God loves and He calls us to do no less.



In October we celebrate the Rosary especially on the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th. The Rosary helps us to meditate on Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection.

October 6 – St. Bruno (1101). Bruno was born in Germany, studied in France and became a theology professor. With six other companions, Bruno founded the Carthusian Order in 1084 and helped reform the clergy in Rome.

October 14 - St. Callistus I (222). A Roman slave, Callistus obtained his

freedom and was ordained a deacon by Pope Zephyrinius, whom he later succeeded. Callistus's election caused an eighteen-year schism, spawning the first anti-pope. In a time of trial and confusion, he reopened the Church to all. He was martyred in Rome.

October 20 - St. Paul of the Cross (1775). Paul was inspired by a vision to start a religious order dedicated to the Passion of Christ.

He founded the Passionists in 1720, lived a penitential life, worked miracles, and cared for the poor and sick.



## Q Why is a& Catholic Funeral A important?

Although no one enjoys dwelling on death, most of us will mourn and bury loved ones in our lifetimes. Friends may counsel us to skip the church funeral and just "get it over with," but our faith

> provides the strength we need to deal with death. The Church has created Rites to help us face the difficulties and reality of death.

Every baptized Catholic has a right to a Catholic funeral. The Rites of a Catholic Funeral include Prayers after Death, Prayers in the Presence of the Body, the Scripture Prayer Service at the Wake, the Funeral at Church (with or without Mass), and the Internment Prayer Service at the cemetery. Together these services not only make up the total Catholic Funeral Service, but also provide the Church's special prayers for the deceased. The Rites also support families and friends who are grieving for their loved one.

Catholics are entitled to a Catholic Funeral whether they are frequent or infrequent Mass attendees. (For specific questions, check with your local parish.)
