

Admonish Sinners: St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226) St. Francis was a rich Italian's son. One day, he heard Jesus' call to build His house and he sold everything to go around preaching about Jesus. St. Francis had a deep concern for all creatures and for the salvation of souls. He constantly called others to repentance, lived a life of penance and strove to be a good example to them. He always approached others with deep humility and compassion and his words healed their souls. Many were moved by his loving ways and mended their lives.

Bear Wrongs Patiently: St. Thérèse of Liseaux (1873-1897) St. Thérèse was a Carmelite nun from France. She tried to love God and others in the little things of her daily life. Once, she tried to give another sister the chance to perform a delightful duty, by not volunteering for it immediately. However she was accused of being lazy. She felt painful for being judged wrongly, but since her silence would not cause harm to anyone, she chose to bear the accusation quietly for the love of God, instead of defending herself.
